

A cool answer to our prayers

Have you noticed the new equipment on top of the south and north confessionals? Have you wondered what they are and why they are there? We have an answer for you.

For many years, as many of you know, our parish has had issues with cooling the Sanctuary, especially the front 1/3, which includes the altar area. It always seemed to malfunction at the hottest times of the year! We have tried to fix the problems, including recently replacing two 25 ton geothermal air handlers, which do not provide sufficient cooling, resulting in a ten ton shortfall in cooling.

But now, we believe we have a solution, one that should cost us little or no money. How can this be?

This year, the ASHRAE (American Society of Heating, Refrigerating, Air-Conditioning Engineers) Wichita chapter came to our rescue. To make a long story short, they are helping our parish by using their resources to develop a Community Sustainability Project which “basically provides the best system for the budget and yet make sure it will leave as small an energy footprint as possible. The project is being worked on by the Chapter members and parishioners and contains elements of energy saving designs utilizing variable refrigerant technology.”

Engineering for the project was donated by Dwayne Vaughn, PE and Phil Voegeli, PE of Integrated Consulting Engineers with design assistance by Sean Miller, PE of Knipp Equipment, Inc. (and parishioner) and Audra Relph, parishioner.

Architectural concepts were developed and donated by Mike Decker of Spangenberg Phillips Tice (SPT) Architecture (also a parishioner).

Construction work is being donated by 3R Mechanical (Rick White & Jerry Curtin) and Shelley Electric (Tom Zoglmann & Curtis Mitchell). All of the Variable Refrigerant System equipment will be donated by Knipp Equipment, Inc. (Ed Lange, Joe Reintjes, Tim Berends, Chad Marlow & John Knipp).

Diffusers and dampers are being donated by Heaven Engineering — no kidding — (Mark O'Donnell & Mike Ternes).

All Refrigerant piping will be donated by the O'Connor Company (Bruce Bishop). The ASHRAE-Wichita Chapter is also donating \$1,000 to the church for purchase of materials to build the new wall enclosures, outdoor equipment pad and fence. A group of church parishioners including Mike Gonzalez & Scott Bergkamp will provide the labor for the enclosures, pad and fence.

Work began in May and hopefully will be completed sometime this month.

Needless to say, we are extremely grateful for this wonderful gift to our parish. Thank you Sean Miller, ASHRAE Wichita chapter president, for your work and energy in this project!
